A lovely show of calves forward today, from the best end continentals to as good a show of Friesian Bull calves that you would find in the midlands. Continentals today a strong trade, with best end British Blue x Bulls to £310 from Stuart Cartwright, with stablemates to £285 and £262. Best Blue Heifers to £245 twice from Phil Dyson, with rearing sorts between £120-£150. Strong native calves topping at £218 for Angus x Bulls from Pete Hemmings with others to £202 for Hereford x Bulls from Pilkington Farms. Heifers saw Angus to £155 fro Pete Hemmings, with Herefords to £145 from Pilkingtons. Rearing sorts selling between £100 and £140 for Bulls, with heifers £60-£100. Dairy Bulls bucking the national trend seeing a strong trade throughout. MRI x Bulls to £192 from AW & J Brandreth for a monster calf, with best end Friesians to £80 from Pilkingtons, with others and £78, £72 and £70. Prime Lambs: 1832 Forward SQQ 170p/kg

A stand on trade with an SQQ of 170p/kg albeit truthfully trade down on the week with a number of orders proving to have no desire for lambs at all. Go0d meated lambs wanted but those short of meat a real struggle with Abbatoirs reporting massive shortfall in sales of lambs. Best lambs rewarded to 205p/kg for 38kg from R Richins, Oxford with Showell Farm, Nuneaton 42kg to 193p/ kg and J B Elkington 192p/kg at 38kg. In the heavies meat wanted but fat or lean lambs not chased at all. A top of 177p/kg for 47kg from Showell Farms and 176p/kg for 51kg from Di Hopcraft. Export lambs topping at £81 for 42kg from Showell Farms with H Collins equal weight at £79.50 and R P Hutchings, Shipston on Stour £79. Overall thick meated lambs to £95 from MM Clarke & Sons at 59kg with equal money for 56kg from Trudy Burman and £91 from R & B Smith, Slapton at 47kg. Today 333 Lambs grossing over £80 despite the fall in trade again swathes of dedicated deadweight vendors washing up on these Shores. Trade is very difficult as reflected all around with the price being paid not the worst issue more the very few numbers being killed at the moment.

CHRISTMAS SHOW RICH FRUIT CAKE

Oven Temperature: 300 F, 150 C, Gas 1-2

Ingredients: 12 oz/325 g Currants 4 1/2 oz/125 g Sultanas 4 1/2 oz/125 g Raisins 3 oz/75 g Glace Cherries 2 oz/50 g Candied Peel A little lemon rind 7 1/2 oz/215 g Plain Flour 1/2 teasp Mixed Spice 1/2 teasp Cinnamon 6 oz/175 g Butter 6 oz/175 g Brown Sugar 3 Large Eggs 1 tablesp Brandy

1. Line an 8 inch round cake tin, using 2 thicknesses of greaseproof paper. Tie a double band of brown paper/newspaper around the outside.

2. Mix the currants, sultanas, raisins, cherries and peel.

3. Cream the butter, sugar and lemon rind until pale and fluffy.

4. Add the beaten eggs and the brandy, a little at a time, beating well after each addition.

- 5. Fold in the flour. Then fold in the fruit.
- 6. Put in to the prepared tin, spread evenly.

7. Place in the pre-heated oven on a layer of brown paper/newspaper, in the lower part of the oven. Cook for approximately 2 3/4 hours

8. When the cake is cooked, leave it to cool in the tin, and then turn out onto a wire rack.

9. Store by wrapping in greaseproof paper and place in an airtight tin.

When judging, the cake will have to be cut in half to see the distribution of the fruit etc. Inserting a skewer will only achieve the taste of the cake. The cake can still be covered in marzipan and icing ready for using at Xmas.


