A better yarding today of cattle that represented all sorts. Over fat cattle and poor grading cattle harder to sell but best sorts massively ahead of alternative deadweights. That said with a deadweight quote of 3.30p/kg at best and many cattle over this bridge struggling to do 52% at the moment those processing sorts in or around 170p/kg well ahead of deadweight comparison.

In the Steers a top of 211p/kg from Merrs Merris with weight selling to a new account close behind more weight from the same home at 204p/kg returning £1426. R grades in short supply today but O+ Steers trading in the 175p/kg region.

Heifers as ever wanted and trading to a renewed competition. Top in this section again to Messrs Merris taking 222p/kg for a properly fed sort ahead of Messrs Baylis Buckingham whom had 218p/kg equal with R W Cross & Partners. Weight paying though and Messrs Merris top of the tree at £1390.

A smaller varding today as the weather limits those able to draw meat but still a shed of 1,540 hoggs. Quality variable and sheep looking like needing supplementary feed to conquer adverse weather conditions. Reports before the sale of a slow in trade but none of it with a lift nationally from the end of last week and weekends trade as buyers seemingly struggle for supply of sheep. SQQ of 181p/kg looking very attractive. In the Euro spec a top of 216p/kg for 44.5kg from Dave Mitchell, Atherstone with Beltex. R J Osborn, Aylesbury travelled up to take 201p/kg for 38kg whilst White Bros of Tamworth had 199p/ kg for equal weights. T E Payne and Son showed smart under weight Beltex at 34.5kg to 199p/kg whilst Will Moore, Leicester had 195p/kg for 43kg Texels. In the heavies Dave Mitchell again top at 210p/kg for 50kg Beltex, PD & DM Hopcraft had 187p/kg for 47.5kg Blues with S E White 186p/kg for 48.5kg allowing an overall average today of 175p/kg all in. In the lump, Euros topped at £96 from D Mitchell with Will Moore £87 for 46kg and £85.50 for 45kg. Overall Dave Mitchell also top man with 50kg at £105 ahead of Lever Farms. Northampton at £101 for 65kg. Suffolks from G Bell, Barby £95 at 72kg equal with R J Batchelor at 63kg. A good days trade but a note to vendors. Buyers must have clean and dry lambs to allow immediate kill. Other outlets such as deadweight's require belly clipping or store lambs to dry out. In order to achieve best returns please present lambs belly clipped and dry. Again we reiterate the ability to deliver lambs on Sunday night into clean dry pens for sale on Monday. Help us to help you. Todays only moan, the inability to send any lambs straight to kill.

SALE REPORT

57th Midshires Produce Auction - Tuesday 5th January 2016

PRICES FOR BARLEY AND WHEAT STRAW CAPTURE THE HEADLINES

An entry of approximately 3,500 tonnes was offered for sale at the A5 Service Park, Clifton upon Dunsmore for the second Midshires Produce Auction of this winter. With samples presented from the vast majority of vendors, prospective purchasers were able to bid with confidence as to the quality of the fodder on offer.

The sale began with a load of Massey Ferguson 2270 bales of meadow hay for immediate delivery from Messrs J Corney & Sons, which achieved £79 per tonne.

Messrs D H Pepper & Sons opened the batting for the produce on farms and helped set the trade for the day selling New Holland 8090 bales of barley straw at £19.80 followed by £17.60 for the wheat straw. £19.80 was achieved for the second time for barley straw, when Mr R J Cook sold New Holland 8090 bales of barley straw at £19.20 and £19.80.

The trade for Hay was similar to last time, but there was a lot more interest shown for conventional bales of meadow hay, suitable for feeding sheep. They sold to a top price of £2.85 per bale.

An exceptional lot of Class Quadrant bales of haylage, from Mr J Penny achieved £16 per bale. Farmers continued to be cautious for their requirements for silage, but a single lot did achieve a top price of £14.00 per bale from Bitteswell Farms.

Chairman's Report Year Ending April 2015

This year has been a very successful one which has seen growth in almost all areas of sales with more new clients coming on to our books.

The fat sheep numbers were up a further 33% which is very credible being on the back of a 40 % increase the previous year . This has brought in more buyers . We can now confidently say we have buyers for all types and qualities of lambs. The cull ewe section also increased by 30%. Plans are in place to improve the sorting alleys and penning.

The store cattle section has seen an increase by 12%. The autumn store sales are a tremendous show piece for our market with 3 capacity sales showing off what our farmers can produce. Buyers come from all around the country to these sales. The fat cattle section continues to struggle with the need for a wholesaler to come. Our numbers have not improved and although this is a national trend we recognise the need to do more.

The cleaning of the market is still the most challenging. This is the largest single cost to the market. When funds allow we intend to put in a recycling system.

Looking forward we recognise there is a need to move on and improve. We must put more pressure on our landlords to provide more maintenance to our site.

We have taken on a part time fieldsman in the south which has helped but we need others in different areas.

On behalf of the board I would like to thank everyone for continuing to support our decisions to try and improve the running of your market. Your opinions are vital to us so please tell us of anything you think should be done to improve your market.

The hard work of all the staff both in the office and outside in the yard is so much appreciated. Everyone is part of the team and the staff are the new clients first impression of the market. I would particularly like to thank the volunteers who help when they are in the market. At peak times your help is invaluable.

Finally I am sure along with the board you will all agree what a great asset to the market Tom Wrench is. His work ethic, efforts and energy seem to be tireless and we are very fortunate to have him at the helm.
