Cattle hard to find this week but trading kicking on up another gear once again with cattle pursued throughout and much needed.

Steers;

Meat and weight well chased throughout and Buyers keen for meat of all descriptions not just limited target 'sweet spots' those cattle with meat taken to the end of the earth and those with cover and confirmation taken even further. Top today 265p/kg for Limousin heavies from G R Fountaine & Son at U grade with U- from TG White, Stratford Upon Avon taking heavies to 260p/kg. R Grades to 240p/kg from Showell Farms, Lincoln with a proper fed Herefords from PC & RA Nichols 238p/kg. In the lump just shy of £1900 for T G White at £1893 and Messrs Fountaine £1817. Messrs White £1690 and a notable mention to £1624 from PC & RA Nichols for Herefords.

Heifers;

Butchers all around and Locals firms needing meat as much as those from away. Real finish today and a definite move as returns have increased to Farmers reinvesting to ensure Cattle are completely finished. It really does pay. Top today a real sweet Heifer from Parry Walters at 270p/kg for handyweights with finish and loin at U grade. TV & J Kennealy making the trip up the M1 from Hemel Hempstead to see 269.5p/kg with weight whilst Messrs Fountaine 268.5p/kg. Weight and finish paying to a top of £1741 from Terry Kennealy with Messrs Fountaine £1660 and Kennealy £1600. Many more needed next week.

Bulls;

Back after an enforced suspension Holsteins from G Ratcliffe saw 178.5p/kg and £1140 other extreme Holsteins around the 160p/kg mark.

Cows;

Trade perhaps just off the boil a little in the Cows but better end still wanted selling to 191p/kg and 182p/kg from A N Calcott & Son returning £1410. Weighted Meat 150p/kg and 146p/kg. Stock Bulls to £1581 for Angus from AEJ & FJ Claridge.

SPRING LAMBS: 2282 FORWARD SQQ 245P/KG AVG £107

A good yarding of lambs seeing a lift in numbers to the 2300 mark. An Sqq of 246p/kg representing a continued swift return with the reoccurrence this week of a number of lean lambs in the pens as Vendors chase trade. Without the wealth of very lean lambs today an SQQ of an extra 8p would surely have been posted. Best end lambs well chased as well as weight which saw a huge lift in trade today. Top export lambs today selling to 310p/kg at 40kg, 293p/kg at 43kg from JA Baskerville & Son with Beltex whilst S & C Hopcraft sold 43kg to 291p/kg with WB Parker, Tysoe 38kg to 284p/kg and P Bodily, Buckingham 38kg to 279p/kg. Heavies wanted throughout as cutting and home trade jobs come onto line. Top in the heavies 279p/kg for Beltex from JA Baskerville & Son at 52kg with GR Fountaine & Son 46kg to 274p/kg and B Wakeham, Ettington 50kg to 270p/kg and 264p/kg. Export weights continuing to mount up with a yard avg over £107. Top Export seeing £126 for 43kg for Messrs Baskerville with £125 from Messrs Hopcraft and 40kg £124 from Messrs Baskerville. Stoke on Trents Mark Bailey saw 45kg at £121 with S & A May, Bromsgrove 45kg to £117.50. Heavies the order of the day and topping out at £146 for 59kg from E Brain & Sons Ltd. Stratford Upon Avon with 52kg from JA Baskerville & Son £145 and D Doody 58kg to £141.50. Plenty of lambs north of £130 today with a real need for meat. Export lambs a two tier trade with meat well in advance of 250p/kg but lean lambs dragging averages back sharply.

Home baking – Fruit Cake

Ingredients:

10oz (275g) currants 6oz (175g) sultanas 6oz (175g) raisins 4oz (100g) glace cherries, quartered 4oz (100g) ready to eat apricot, snipped into pieces 2oz (mixed candied peel, finely chopped 3 tablespoons brandy 8oz (225g) plain flour ½ teaspoon grated or dried nutmeg ½ teaspoon mixed spice 8oz (225g) soft margarine or softened butter 8oz (225g) dark muscovado sugar

4 large eggs 2oz (50g) whole almonds, chopped 1 scant tablespoon black treacle grated rind of 1 lemon grated rind of 1 orange

To finish: Brandy to feed

Method:

Begin this cake the night before you want to bake it. Measure the prepared fruits into a large bowl, mix in the brandy, cover and leave in a cool place over night.

Pre-heat the oven to $140^{\circ}/275^{\circ}$ F/Gas 1. Grease and line an 8in (20cm) deep round cake tin with a double layer of greased greaseproof paper.

Measure the flour, spices, margarine or butter, sugar, eggs, almonds, treacle, lemon and orange rinds into a large bowl. Beat well to mix thoroughly, then fold in the soaked fruits. Spoon the mixture into the prepared tin and spread out evenly with the back of a spoon.

Cover the top of the cake loosely with a double layer of greaseproof paper.

Bake in the pre-heated oven for about 4-4 $\frac{1}{2}$ hours or until the cake feels firm to the touch and a skewer inserted into the centre comes out clean. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

When cool, pierce the cake at intervals with a fine skewer and feed with a little brandy. Wrap the completely cold cake in a double layer of greaseproof paper and again in foil and store in a cool place for up to 3 months, feeding a t intervals with more brandy.

Leave undecorated.
