PRIME CATTLE: 39 HEAD

After last weeks trade, extra buyers were at ringside anxious to buy cattle, but only if there were in spec. Numbers are needed to supply demand from the 8 buyers at ringside.

BULLS:

Just the one bull forward a heavyweight Charolais from A.J. Bostock which weighed 801Kilo, and sold for 127p and realised £1017.00, as ever more at needed to supply demand.

A small entry of indifferent quality was on offer to a keen ring of buyers. Trade was good but quality was Short with the one quality steer from Frank Hodgkin selling to 184p and grossed £1242.

Nearly 100 calves forward again seeing a much more two tier trade than in previous weeks. Best end Continentals to £295 for a Limousin x Bull from WJ Pearson & Son, with strong British Blue x Bulls to £290 from Stuart Cartwright, no rearing sorts to speak of as such. Best natives to £240 for Angus x Bulls from Mark Bailey, Biddulph Moor, with others to £220 from Pete Hemmings. Best Angus Heifers to £172 from the Hemmings, with rearing Hereford x trading between £50 and £100. Best end dairy bred calves saw Fleckviehs to £212(X2) from R Jones & Son with others to £198. Best end Friesian rearers to £90, with most trading £60-80. Bigger processing sorts around the £40 mark, with mediums £30-£35 and smalls around the £20 mark.

Prime Lambs: 1132 Forward SQQ 173p/kg A few less lambs about following Fridays Ram Sales but still 1100 penned. A

much improved quality of yarding, appreciated by buyers and returning the days highest National SQQ of 173p/kg well ahead of any deadweight comparison by upwards of 12p/kg. Best meated lambs well supported albeit top end bred lambs not conducting the premium seen in past months. That said best end Exporters getting stuck in today. In the Euro section a top of 205p/kg from Three Shires Farming, Banbury. Best meated home trade super light weights a real trade seeing 33kg to 200p/kg from William Rogers. Slightly over thick but showing Shape R Richins Beltex at 40kg to 200p/kg. Weighted meat rewarded from start to finish with 46kg at 182p/kg from B C Burton whilst R Haynes, Badby 46kg to 179p/ kg and Midland Environmental, Naesby sold overnight lambs to 176p/kg for 49kg. In the lump Euro spec lambs sold today to £82 for 40kg from Three Shires Farming whilst Poulson & Co, Market Bosworth 43kg to £82 and Kieth Foxon 44kg at £81. Overall heavy Lambs meeting a nice trade throughout despite a slow in this section in other markets. Meat though the key selling to £99 for 66kg from R Wright with 65kg £96 from R Haynes, Claverdon whom sold £94 to 58kg and 55kg at £93. Today 350 lambs sold at £80 or over, not a deadweight in the land can do that.

Charollais Ewes proved to show the trade with Alan Thomas's second leaner pen making £102 with the fat £99. Other Rams from Midland Environmental £100 with Oxford Rams to £100 from Garth Doyle, Longtown. Suffolks from R S Beaty & Sons £96 and £93 from F Hodgkins. Mules to £74 from Heritage Farms. Trade strong throughout and up £7 perhaps.

A much bigger show of stores than expected today meeting a firmer trade for the quality on offer than has been seen. Ewe Lambs from RT Haynes to £96 for Texels, with others to £94. Top stores from V Manning to £69 with others to £66 from M Wallington. Strong stores £58-£64 today, with better end farming sorts £55-£57. Harder bred farming lambs £48-£52 with small brethren £42-£46. Only the very small and hard bred under £40.

Ram Fair 27th September

The company held its annual Ram Fair on Friday 27th September where a catalogue entry 312 Rams were forward, both MV and non MV. The majority of the rams were Charolais, Suffolk and Texel with a larger percentage of ram lambs forward.

Prior to the sale the show was judged by Mr Graham Humphrey, who went about his task, looking for the modern sires characteristics, notably size, shape and good skins. The final line in the shearlings saw 5 sheep out and after much deliberation the 1st prize went to a Messrs William's Texel. The Ram Lamb class numerically stronger saw a final line up of 7 rams, and the judge's choice was the pen leader from Ces Thomas. Competing for the Graham Thomas Perpetual Trophy for the overall Champion Ram, the judge picked Ces Thomas Charollais lamb as Champion.

The sale commenced with a strong company of potential buyers at ringside, trade was good throughout with good sheep in demand, while smaller plainer sheep were difficult to cash, 60% clearance was achieved. Topping the MV section was the pen leader from Slapton, and stood 3rd in the show, well turned out by Barbara and family the Texel shearling realised 550 gns, with the pen averaging just short of 500 gns. Lambs sold to a top of 410 gns for the champion from Ces, who last won the championship 26 years ago.

Top prize of the day was 600gns for the pen leader from Garfield Stephens in the Non MV, who's pen of strong Charolais shearlings met an excellent trade.

CHRISTMAS SHOW RICH FRUIT CAKE

Oven Temperature: 300 F, 150 C, Gas 1-2

Ingredients:

3 Large Eggs 1 tablesp Brandy

12 oz/325 g Currants 4 1/2 oz/125 g Sultanas 4 1/2 oz/125 g Raisins 3 oz/75 g Glace Cherries 2 oz/50 g Candied Peel A little lemon rind 7 1/2 oz/215 g Plain Flour 1/2 teasp Mixed Spice 1/2 teasp Cinnamon 6 oz/175 g Butter 6 oz/175 g Brown Sugar

- 1. Line an 8 inch round cake tin, using 2 thicknesses of greaseproof paper. Tie a double band of brown paper/newspaper around the outside.
- 2. Mix the currants, sultanas, raisins, cherries and peel.
- 3. Cream the butter, sugar and lemon rind until pale and fluffy.
- 4. Add the beaten eggs and the brandy, a little at a time, beating well after each addition.
- 5. Fold in the flour. Then fold in the fruit.
- 6. Put in to the prepared tin, spread evenly.
- 7. Place in the pre-heated oven on a layer of brown paper/newspaper, in the lower part of the oven. Cook for approximately 2 3/4 hours
- 8. When the cake is cooked, leave it to cool in the tin, and then turn out onto a wire rack.
- 9. Store by wrapping in greaseproof paper and place in an airtight tin.

When judging, the cake will have to be cut in half to see the distribution of the fruit etc. Inserting a skewer will only achieve the taste of the cake. The cake can still be covered in marzipan and icing ready for using at Xmas.
