Trade very swift to level at an SQQ 225.39p/kg for a yard short on quality compared to the previous week. Trade though phenomenal for the time of year and pounds ahead of the deadweight as proper Market forces of Supply and Demand kick into play. Export quality the pick of the day with Continental accounts pinned to the ringside. Top today for Beltex from SLAM Farming with there first draw selling 37kg to 265p/kg ahead of David Wadland with 40kg and 41kg 262 and 263p/kg, M J Phillips, Buckingham 261p/kg and SLAM Farming 260p/kg at 37.5kg. R Richins and R Woodward 258p/ kg at 43kg and 45kg respectively. Weight the order of the day today and meated weight hunted throughout selling to 250p/kg at 48kg from Messrs Wadland with JP Page & Sons 47kg to 245p/ kg and E Brain & Sons Ltd, Stratford Upon Avon 48kg to 240p/kg. In the lump trade throughout with the yarding avg £96. Euro weighted lambs topping out at £116 for 45kg from R Woodward and BF Humphrey & Sons £115 at equal weight. R Richins 43kg to £111 and J Rutter & Son, Shipston on Stour 44kg at £110. Weight does pay and topping today at £127.50 for R W Harrison & Sons at 56kg ahead of Hillside farm at 63kg to £126 and M J Phillips 57.5kg to £124. Trade throughout and Buyers thankful of Vendors support many of whom having to make 6 day standstill arrangements. Thank you.

FRIDAY 28TH BREEDING FAIR

That time of year again and the continued expansion of the fixture with Sheep being sold to Devon, Essex, Lancashire, Cumbria, Monmouthshire, Yorkshire and not to forget the Norfolk wanderers. Buyers out in force from start to finish and a swift trade throughout if not a fairer trade than July with the bottom end sheep discounted accordingly. As usual we started with the aged Ewes which met a spirited enquiry to see a top of £150 for a pen of 24 FM Texel x Ewes from J B Elkington, Hethe who sold others to £130 and 6T to £135. Aged Mules saw £100 from R Hicks and Suffolks £120 from Leam farming. J C Salmon, Newquay sold Cheviot aged Ewes to £123 for 40. Double Theaves continue to be the farmers choice seeing NCM from IM Allen & Partners to £131 to a Derbyshire Flock Master. Welsh Mule Doubles from M Woodward saw £134 with most Mules over the £120 mark.

On into the Theaves and as has been the case White Faces well followed albeit on a more selective trade subject to quality. S Gore kicked us off well to see Pure Texels in a pen of 11 to £195. J B Elkington then took his Texel x Beltex to £170 and £165 before showing Beltex to a top for the day of £250 followed by his Logie Durno Blues to £195. Beltex Theaves from Leam Farming wonderfully shown and bred by a young man with an eye came down at £208 ahead of similar goods from DS & LA Wadland at £200. Texel x Mules shorter on quality but generally £150 to £135. On into the Suffolks and trade very strong with quality not a patch on the July sale. Topping at £169 for the first pen into the ring from PE & EH King who sold others £154. Next in J C Salmon from Newquay saw £163 and others £152.

Today saw the 4th year of the North Country Mule Show and Sale for Nemsa reg sheep. The success of the day is witnessed by the continued support of our Sponsors MSD agri Care, Sheldon Boseley Knight and Stow Ag who sponsored perhaps the most Successful Mule sale for some years. We are also grateful for the Support of the Hawes Branch of the Society. This year our Judges included Mr Neil White, Merrick on behalf of the North of England and Mr Graham Humphreys on behalf of the South. Our Heartfelt Thanks to both. Mule trade today seeing an overall average not including Charity Sheep to level at £153 for the 1600 forward. Best end in high demand and fought for throughout. Jim Wadland kicked us off to a great start with strong dry sheep in big pens to £164 with others to £168 and £166. Lesser dry sheep then trading in the early £140's before SF & AJ Deeming saw there first pen to £180 and £168.50 for lambed Theaves with dry Theaves to £159 the family donating £50 also to Charity. Estate dry sheep from Cottesbrooke Estates saw there run of 251 avg £143. Annual consignee B P Cannon went away very happy seeing the run top at £171.50 with others £163.50 all ran dry.

Martin Wooward showed quality lambed sheep in working clothes to £170 and £163.50 and Welsh Lambed to £158 before Alan and Jemima Collett saw there 3^{rd} prized pen take £173 for lambed with others £160 and £156 and dry Theaves £145 for 43. The Daughters though only split by 50p with Z Collett selling at £169.50 and H Collett £169 one daughter selling to Essex the other to Yorkshire. Lambed Theaves from A Cook, £143 and £141. J & H Tustian next in with a run to rival any. The Families run of 112 not including the Charity Theave avg £184 and are testament to the quality of the stock. The first of his run saw the Champion pen of 20 eventually set anchor at £216 to the Judge Mr Humphreys after being bid on from 5 different Counties. The second pen followed close behind to the judge at £205 and the third pen to Cumbria at £185. Others £170 to Derbyshire and £158 Essex. A good run of Welsh Mules from Vic Newton took £148, £138, £135 and £137. PE & EH King rounded a fully successful day off with £160.50 for dry Theaves and P Cowley took £150 for his Theaves to return to there Native Yorkshire. Last man in G Royans & Son saw trade hold to the end taking £149 for lambed Theaves and £148 for dry.

The pre-sale show was ably and expertly judged by Mr Mark Humphreys, Buckingham, who carefully selected his prize winners from several difficult classes and our thanks go to him. After much deliberation he finally settled on his champion pen of three shearling rams, a pen of Charollais hailing from Charles Sercombe, who receives the Heygates Perpetual Trophy. Commencing as the heavens opened at 2PM, the trade was something that definitely wasn't dampened, with style and shape high on the purchasers priorities.
