SPRING LAMBS: 1721 FORWARD SQQ 226P/KG

A post Quarbani varding of just over 1700 lambs today. Our thanks to farmers for working with us to restrict numbers on a day where demand is as expected low following the massive purge for EID over the weekend. These actions resulted in a wonderful trade today for the goods on offer and consequently hopefully a sustainable trade in the coming weeks. An SQQ of 226p/kg representing a storming trade considering a poor show of lambs on the whole with many showing an effect to the hot weather at the latter end of the week. Lambs now starting to lose there backs and vendors encouraged to push lambs to meat to take the best rewards of this unprecedented period of trade. Best end Export lambs wanted with Belgium and Dutch accounts very strong today seeing a top of 281p/kg for a pen of 9 Beltex at 40kg from M J Woodward ahead of GR Fountaine & Son with 44.5kg to 272p/kg and Julian White of J & S White Farms Ltd taking 270p/kg and 262p/kg for 40kg and 35.5kg. Pritchard Farms 38kg to 261p/kg. In the heavies trade remaining very stable to see 48kg at 240p/kg from PD & DM Hopcraft whilst the usual quality from Culworth Grounds saw 46kg to 235p/kg and J A Owen, Piddington 49kg to 233p/kg with Julian White 47.5kg to 232p/kg. In the lump Euro weights topping out at £121 for 44.5kg from G R Fountaine & Son with a good sized pen up from Milton Keynes. M J Woodward saw £112.50 for 40kg and J & S White 20 Berrichon lambs at 42.5kg to £110. Overall a top today of £126 at 57kg from J A Owen, Piddington whilst Ted Taylor took £123 at 59kg and FJ Tombs & Son £117.50 for a pen of 8 and 16 and £116 equal with M & T Austin, Harbury. Trade hopefully will hold in the coming weeks as numbers continue to be killed. Thanks to all involved.

Trade as a result very acceptable with big strong Ewes easily sold whereas fat Ewes £10 less on the week with the opportunity to sell fat during Eid now having passed. No pure bred Ewes forward. Top today £109 and £106 for Suffolks from K Butcher, Thrapston ahead of Dorsets at £106 from B & SM Sutton with RF Staveley & Son £105.50 for Berrichon. Milk sheep to £88.50 from Titcomb and Keen and Mules to £82.50 from A Colinswood, Thame. Ewes likely to hold a steady trade going forward with grazing Ewes and Fat the hardest of commodities to sell.

First Annual Breeding Fair:

That time of year again and the addition of Store lambs on the night prior this year. A nice yarding of just over 3000 for this Fixture seeing perhaps the hottest day we have sold under in Stoneleigh and predictably a description of the trade to match the weather. In truth a trade that reflected a large Compliment of buying accounts that had been selling Ewes and lambs at an unprecedented. Buyers from far and wide resulted in trade well ahead of expectations. It started from the very beginning with 6t and FM Charollais x Ewes from R Hicks to £130 equal description Texel Ewes from JonJoe Morris saw £153 with others £148. Annual consignments of draft Ewes from SF & AJ Deeming saw FM Suffolk x Cheviot Ewes to £137.50 for pens of 20 with Suffolk x NCM £133.50 and £127. FM Mules to £99 from Messrs Bevin, Market Harbrough and Lleyns £104 from Walton Estates. 6 Tooth Scotch Half bred Ewes from J Coe, Essex to £136 and £132 whilst 6 Tooth NCM from Hedges & Kerwood saw £127 and £125.50.

Into the Theaves and the White faced section shot off to £154 for Texel x Cheviot Mule Theaves ran dry from CJ & MT Clayton whilst more Tex x NCM to £148 x 2 pens again from Chris plus £145. S Oakes, Derby used this ring for his first outing to see £156 for Blue Texels and Texel x all ran dry to £140. Messrs Bevin, Market Harbrough saw £148 for their flock dispersal. Classy theaves from M J Woodward topped the section at £164 with others £160 and £158. No real real bred White faced Sheep today but a real hunger for Continentals evident. BM & LE Aries showed a smart uniformed run to £160.50 with others £154. I Newton & Sons, Henley in Arden showed 124 to top at £150.50 and avg £147.65. Almost all trading over the £140 mark. On into the Suffolks and trade perhaps even stronger with the focus of the fixture for early lambing systems. Waddesdon Farm Estates showed the usual quality to top there run at £150.50 with others £149.50. Nice Suffolks having lambed from Angela Tarry-Smith saw a lot of interest with the benefit of having been lambed finally stopping at £159.50. Philly Batchelor did her father proud showing her 80 ran dry Suffolks to £156, £154.50, £153 and £146.50. Top Gun for the day again M J Woodward topping at £160.50 with others £155.50 and £149.50. Team Aries again keeping up the good showing selling to £149.50. A Foulds & Partners, Norfolk made the annual sales trip to top at £152 and £150 before the annual consignment of 320 Suffolk x Theaves from Welsh Mules consigned by the Deeming Family. Topping the run at £159 and £155 the total run eventually averaging £151. On into the Mules and in all fairness a below par showing on the whole with the weather perhaps dictating it a little early to show Mules. None the less a top of £145 from Cottesbrooke Estates who also sold to £130. Waddesdon Estates took £140 and A Cook. Stratford Upon Avon £140 with all Mules on the day sold Ran dry. Perhaps as to highlight the interest in the coming lambing season we ended the day with a pen of Jacob dry Theaves at £140 from Fir Tree Farming.

We go again at the end of August when a full yarding is expected.

Possibly the best trade I have experienced in my time selling store sheep. Faces all around the ringside from near and far, fit for sheep. Top of the tree saw a pen of Texel x ewe lambs from PA & K Barnes selling to £100. JW Pickford & Son sold Suffolk x Wethers to £91 and £82 respectively. Plenty of lambs up over £80 today, with the best end of the medium keeping lambs all in the late £70's. Harder bred medium lambs actively £68-£74 with very little today sold under £65. A run of 190 lambs, as part of a full dispersal on behalf of the Bevin Family averaged £70.40 with every lamb included! More lambs are required for Friday 21st of August.
