Just over 2000 lambs today and a trade that was fast for all albeit some customers not even getting going unable to keep with the pace at 227p/kg SQQ. Best end lambs completely in fashion with a £20 swing of equal weights between better shaped and finished lambs in comparison to some of the Store lambs sold in the fat today. Top today to the first pen in the draw from R Richins, Oxford selling 44.5kg Beltex to 265p/kg ahead of DS & LA Wadlans with 264p/kg at 45kg. Beltex of 40kg from R J Heckford saw 260p/kg equal with 41.5kg from DS & LA Wadland. In the weighted lambs trade almost stronger than the Export weight lambs selling to 261p/ kg for 46kg for Benjamin Nichols, Red House. Messrs Wadland in the wake at 252p/ kg at 46kg with Lincolnshires, Showell Farms 46kg to 246p/kg and GR Fountaine 47kg to 245pkg. In the lump Export lambs topping out at £119 for 45kg from David Wadland with R Richins, 44.5kg to £118 and Messrs Wadland £115 at 45kg. Ben Nichols sold 44kg to £113 with close friend B C Burton 44.5kg to £112. Overall weight paying topping out at £127.50 for A J North, Thame with 60.5kg ahead of G Bostock & Sons £126.50 for 56kg ahead of Showell Farms at equal weight to £122. RAE Wilson, Ben Nichols and H L Goode & Son all breaking the £120 barrier. Lambs a unbelievable trade with every lamb in averaging £96. Today the return of very lean lambs in the ailes or very light lambs. In both cases the current trade does not leave the cost to abbatoirs to kill these feasible for such commodities. Please make sure lambs are weighing over 41kg and fully finished next week.

Just under 2000 Ewe Lambs for this Annual fixture which included the Modulamb Plate Competition for the best pen of 20 Suffolk Ewe Lambs. This year ably Judged by Dan Aries, Banbury. Our Thanks to Dan.

Trade today was always going to be a matter of finding a rate where all parties felt comfortable on their abilty to earn, as a result of the unprecedented residual value provided by the fat lamb market. A difficult conundrum to overcome with buyers fresh from wonderful returns from fat lambs and selling breeding Theaves but fully aware of the vulnerability of the Breeding sheep trade a full 12 months ahead. That said we did manage to complete a 88% clearance of the Suffolks with an avg of £106. Best end lambs saw Humphrey Livestocks 2^{nd} and third pen take £130 on both occasions with the Champions for the day from T H Morris & Sons to £120 equal with Messrs Tarry-Smith and Humphrey Livestock's first pen. Strong Tupping lambs all over £100 with mediums trading £95 and only one pen under £90. In this Section Jon-joe Morris donated a lamb to Cancer Research in memory of his grandfather. This was bought by Garth Doyle for £140 before being put up to sell to M W Warner at £140 R Smith & Son for £147, W Baker at £140, Leam Farming at £145, D Doody Livestock Hauliers at £139, J Hill at £140 and then once again at £140 to J Hill. Our thanks to all those that gave so generously.

White face Ewe lambs out in force today albeit a general lack of power forward with the majority on show running lambs save as for a few. Topping the trade Texels from Cheviot Mules for A J Geary returning £125 and £120 ahead of Humphrey Livestock with Texels to £117, £112 and £100 no purebreds around today and Cheviot Mule or Cheviot x Mule well chased to £112 for G Doyle with Cheviots Mules and Z Collett £109 and Ian Birden £105. Most Ewe lambs trading over £90 with only light runners under.
