Last Friday saw the first breakaway of the traditional RFM Suffolk Ewe lamb sale from the August Breeding sheep fixture. This was done in recognition both of the increase in the Ewe lamb sales popularity as well as continued entries of general breeding sheep to be sold at the August fixture next week. This year we have been honoured to have the backing of the Suffolk Sheep Society whom offered prize money for the best pens of 20 or more Suffolk Ewe lambs all competing for the Modulamb Perpetual Cup. The Judge this year Mr Proll of Tiverton, Devon takes our Thanks for completing a very difficult task in placing the top three pens. He commented, along with others what a marvellous selection of Tupping lambs where penned within the 2500 on offer. After much deliberation the Judge placed Mark and William Warner, Southam in first place with Angela Tarry-Smith & Nephew, Brackley in second and Humphrey Livestock, Brackley in third. Our congratulations to all the winners and especially to Will Warner for his efforts this year in winning the class for the first time. Trade must be reported as finding two tiers with Tupping lambs receiving a spirited enquiry with buyers travelling some distance to select Tupping lambs whilst running lambs a harder trade with usual vendors reporting poor trades for there sale of last years dry Theaves leaving a short margin. Quality though sells and the prize winning pen from the Warners selling to £114 as the judge was made to sweat as he backed his judgment. Size length and breeding rewarded Angela Tarry-Smith and Tom Tarry at £107 for their second placed pen with others £95 and £90. Messrs Warner also too £98, £94 and £89 whilst Humphrey Livestock saw £98, £97 and £95. Messrs Olerenshaw showed a single pen of strength to take Suffolks out of Welsh Mules to £99. Tupping lambs generally trading £89 to £114 with other notable mentions of £93 for J & J Tredwell and £90 for Oaklands College, Hertfordshire. Running lambs a harder trade with the best end in the £85 region but buyers selective as they try to safe guard next years margin in selling dry cropped Theaves. The Continental section within the sale found a swift enquiry with BMF Smith seeing Texels sold to £94 for wonderful strength whilst R J Reeve to £89. Just a handful of Suffolk Theaves today met a marvellous trade seeing Rob & Caroline Mole show lambed Theaves to £144, £141 and the end of line at £128 whilst M J Woodward showed similar goods to £138. As with the Ewe lambs the Suffolk Tup trade very reflective of quality. Strong Shearlings from L Needham saw 600 Guineas for the Champion Shearling whilst Ram lambs from TC & CA Harding saw 540 Guineas. We will have a further 5500 Breeding Sheep this Friday along with 103 NSA Rams and 60 Commercial Rams.

A harder days trading all around as the Mobile phones called buyers at the aisles side to tell them of lower demand across the land. Saying that though a two tier trade with good meated lambs all operating well over 190p/kg but a wealth of leaner lambs in the 180p/kg mark. Today it was commented on by many that the show of lambs within the 2300 would be as poor a show as seen for many years. Seemingly grass conditions are taking there toll. An SQQ of 186p/kg puts us in the top few centres for the day and equates to 409p/kg deadweight on last weeks killing percentages. Light lambs and lean sorts are very much discounted this year. In the Euro spec a top of 206p/kg for 39.5kg from W G Moore ahead of JMT Engineering at 41kg to 198p/kg and F & J Clarke 35kg Beltex at 197p/kg. 40kg from Wally McCurdie saw 196p/ kg. In the heavies 47kg from PT Harris & Son, Northampton 191p/kg whilst R Phizacklea & Co 190p/kg for 47kg and Alison Pittom the same for half a kg lighter. Heavies from S & J Farming to £92 for 49kg. In the lump 45kg topped the Euro section for Seckington at £86.50. Overall £97 top today for W F Heady & Son for 53kg whilst Stimson Farming £96.50 for 53kg and Ted Taylor £96 for 55kg. A farmers sale today with meated and weighted lambs well ahead of anything the deadweight can offer. Lean and underweight lambs now starting to depress the National market and producers should look to market a lamb suitable for requirements whenever possible.
