PRIME CATTLE: 49 HEAD

An increased entry, containing a bit of everything was on offer to the usual good ring of buyers who wanted all types of clean cattle at similar rates, while cows as with the national trend have to be quoted cheaper.

BULLS: 4 HEAD.

An entry of native breeds met good competition selling to 160p for a black bull from Geoff and Sue, Holsteins sold to 129p from Ian Sharlot grossing £697.00. A new buyer at ringside could do with dairy bred bulls on a weekly basis.

STEERS: 12 HEAD.

An entry with some super cattle and also some plain Black-white's met an excellent selling trade with cattle holding late rates. Richard Fountaine and Family topped the section and sale with a wonderful heavyweight homebred Limousin which sold to 222p, followed by Brian at 208p for heavyweight Charolais. Top price per head was £1491.84 from Hill Farm.

HEIFERS: 33 HEAD.

As ever the strongest class for numbers and quality, saw a good trade throughout with the working class cattle the best to sell. The section topped at 216p twice, firstly for a Charolais from Brian Smith and secondly from Richard Fountaine with a home bred Blue. Red House had others at 214p, with Tom and Roger selling Limousin's to 214p.

OVERAGE AND COWS: 20 HEAD.

An extremely varied entry, containing Dexters, fed and wet Bagged sucklers, Continental types, but the market system showed its worth with competition from all corners of the ringside. As nationally trade was quieter with buyers complaining of abattoir backlogs, topping the section was a Limousin Cross Cow at 123p from Messrs Wrench who sold others to 119p. Top price per head was £1030.70 for a monster South Devon Cow from Roger and Tom Elliott. FARMERS: Leaves are falling, frost's are a regular morning issue, you want to sell cattle. PRIME LAMBS: 2193 Forward SQQ 174p/kg

Despite constant communication with some customers regarding the restrictions upon trade, but despite this still well over 2000 lambs in the aisles today as the local abbatoir turned customers away resulting in large consignments arriving on these shores unannounced. Trade subdued as expected albeit export lambs looking a good touch for some smart lambs travelling down from three Derbyshire farmers rewarded by a new account at ringside all the way from Dubai. An Sqq of 174p/kg really quite a result and our thanks to loyal Wholesale Customers for rewarding farmers well in excess of the deadweight option. Heavies a much harder sell and supply now massively outweighing demand. In the Euro section a top today of 205p/kg for Beltex for Dave Thornley, Swadlincote at 39kg for Beltex. W & J Griffin, Oakham 39 and 39.5kg to 203 and 200p/kg. B C Burton, Banbury 42.5kg to 198p/kg. J Rutter, Shipston on Stour 37kg to 197p/kg. In the heavies a top of 48kg at 178p/kg for J & JM Edwards & Sons, Derby ahead of R Richins 48kg to 176p/kg and Midland Environmental Services 46kg at 170p/kg. In the lump Euro lambs still to £84 for 42.5kg from B C Burton with others £84 and £83 from the same home at 43kg. G R Fountaine 45kg to £84. Overall heavies a very hard sell with a top of £90 for 66kg from Stimson Farming Partnership. Midland Environmental sold 57kg at £89 and H L Goode 57.5kg to £87.50. Trade very difficult throughout and a influx of numbers not pre-booked unfair on buyers and those booked in. Lambs must be pre-booked with a RFM Staff member before sale day

Friday 22nd October Store Cattle Fair: Forward

What a difference a week makes. Half as many buyers but a trade £100 up on the week. In both sales this year we have seen trade for best end sorts in a year that is producing a poor quality of Store Cattle. Any Cattle that will hit the grid or Butchers Spec very well competed for today and those that did not show there cattle will of made a big mistake. Young Cattle a surprisingly good trade for quality sorts seeing £790 for 11 month old Simmentals from T H Morris & Sons. Bulls from R H Burman £770 at 7 months of age. Real quality yearling from J R Smith, Wellesbourne saw £1100 Limousin Steers, £1050 for Simmentals and £1160 for British Blues, quality seemingly does pay. Bucket calf Angus from H Hurst & Son saw £750 and Limousin at £740 both 12 months of age. 14 month old Limousin from Messrs Semple take £920 and £875 for Steers.

Smart cattle in the mid ages from John and Kathy Stephens saw £1105, £1100, £1080,£1070, £1065, £1050 and £1040 with heifers to £1080 at equal age. 17 month old Simmental Steers from T H Morris saw £985 with heifers £1040. Bucket reared Angus Steers at 19 months from I & T Greenfield saw £1110 and £1050 whilst Blue Bucket heifers at 17 months saw £980. David Sharlots clearing ups saw £910 for Hereford Steers at 22 months. A nice consignment from Frankie Badger saw £1020 for Angus Steers at 18 months and £1150 for Beef Shorthorns at 23 months from GM & LD Robson.
