# CATTLE: 127 Forward



43 selling over £2,000 – 24 over £2,100.

A nice yarding of cattle forwards today, with all spec included, from the best to the also-rans. Trade was swift throughout, with cattle judged on their merits.

Top today in the steers was 342p/kg for a sweet Limousin-weighted steer from RW & HER Trivett, Atherstone. First-time vendor JC & A Hutchinson, Clay Coton, followed at 334p/kg, with extreme Blues from J Cooper & Son at 328p/kg. Best R grades to U grades traded 318–320p/kg, with U grades money.

The top gross for weight and shape went to RF & J Nichols, selling Charolais steers for £2,707 and £2,558. Josh Trivett sold to £2,353, and PR Mann's steers fetched £2,346. O grades traded between 272p/kg and 294p/kg.

Heifers reached 341p/kg for heavy meat heifers from R Ellis & Son, with Limousin heifers and Messrs Trivett at 340p/kg. J Cooper and RW & HER Trivett followed closely at 338p/kg and 339p/kg. R grades all traded over 300p/kg, and O grades sold for 280p/kg plus.

Top £2,500 for the Nichols stable of weight, with Messrs Trivett achieving £2,224. Meat was very well rewarded throughout, whatever the grade.

Bulls saw more meat and quality, with real shape and meat from HW & AJ Eadon, selling to 327p/kg and 320p/kg for super U-grade bulls. Messrs Wilks followed at 318p/kg. R grades traded 300p/kg plus.

Top gross was £2,472 and £2,237 for Messrs Eadon.

Cows saw a fast trade today, with another large buying account firing at cows, assured or otherwise. Top today was a 35-month-old slip from FI & EJ Barnes, at 275p/kg. Aged cows saw the best meat, with an R-grade Simmental 4-year-old from the same vendor at 225p/kg. Hereford meat O+ from R J Wright reached 217p/kg, and heavy Charolais from Messrs JK Smith sold for 210p/kg. R grades were all over 200p/kg, with a deadweight equal to 430p/kg dw. O grades traded between 188p/kg and 200p/kg. Lean boner cattle were on realisation.

In the lump, £1,941 for JK Smith & Sons and £1,914 for Messrs Barnes

# SPRING LAMBS 1508 FORWARD SQQ 324P/KG AVG £144.54

All in average of £144.50.

1,500 plus forwards after another wet weekend. Not the quality on show of last week's yarding, but a competitive trade throughout with the best lambs in highest demand.

Top of the pops today for Derby-based S Oakes & Son, selling Beltex at 38.5kg to 387p/kg. R Richins, Oxford, sold 45kg at 387p/kg, also selling 43kg at 385p/kg. G L Woodard's 44.5kg lambs reached 382p/kg, and M J Woodward's 42kg lambs sold to 369p/kg. The SQQ was 3.27p/kg, a marvellously competitive trade throughout. Better meat often traded 350p/kg plus for export weights, with meat lambs all trading 330p/kg plus. First cross lambs were 310–320p/kg, with the odd hill lamb and store lamb trading under 300p/kg.

Weight remains in vogue, albeit overweight and first cross lean weight lambs were harder to sell today. Meat and middle-weight lambs traded well, with the top at 371p/kg for 48kg lambs from M J Woodward. BF Humphrey & Sons sold 47.5kg lambs at 365p/kg, and J Hope Sheep Services sold 48kg lambs at equal money. Meat and weight for 46–48kg lambs traded regularly around the 350p/kg mark. Heavyweights today saw 300p/kg as the regular mark, but overweight and lean lambs today traded between 280–290p/kg.

In the lump, export weights reached a big £174 for 45kg lambs from R Richins, and £170 for 44.5kg lambs from G Woodard. R Richins also sold 43kg lambs for £165.50, and Ann Wilson Rouge's 45kg lambs reached £159. Plenty of lambs today sold for over £150.

Top today, though, for a monster from S & J Farming with 75kg at £194, and H S Underwood & Son's 66kg lambs at £191. M Bills, Leicester, sold 57kg lambs for £188, and M J Woodward sold lambs at £187. Berkeley Hicks from God's Country sold 65kg lambs for £187.

Trade remains very favourable. Meat, though, is the key, with a fair few runs of store sorts through today.

Bellies must now be clean and crutched. Lambs binned due to contamination will not be insured.

Another small yarding meeting an average of £134 throughout. Trade still flying, albeit calmed from the fallout trade experienced in the middle of last week.

A top of £238 for Rams from A K Wilson, with Texel Ewes from M Bills to £221.50. Other Rams from Ann Wilson sold to £220, with Texel Ewes from S Wise reaching £212 and £200 for J Boulton. There was no real quality weight forwards, and most White-faced first cross the best on show traded £180 plus.

Suffolks sold to £195 for J Hope Sheep Services, with S & J Farming achieving £182. Suffolks generally £160 plus, albeit short on Suffolk size today. Mainly Mules were forwards, with a top of £191 for Welsh from G Scrivens, also selling at £179, and Minshull at £166 for NCM. Mules with weight sold all over £140.

Meat Ewes showed a real trade, and more fed Ewes are needed

# STORE CATTLE REPORT - 28.11.24



Numbers remain sparse as we continue to be in the mysterious position of being an island outside of the main Blue Tongue Zone (BTZ). I'm sure this must just be a coincidence.

However, the non-Zone cattle forwards are reaping the reward, with a trade £150 a head dearer than BTZ cattle sold in the same week.

Starting with grazing cows, A. Neary saw three 2022 cows sell to £1210, with calves from the same 14 months taking Simmental steers to £1305.

First-time vendors, Messrs. Morris from Malvern, experienced a flying demand for honest yearling sorts. Their Limousin steers sold to £1460, £1350, and £1345. Slightly older Limousin steers, aged 15-16 months, then sold for £1570 and £1480. The same vendor also sold a framey Blue steer (27 months) for £1800. A worthwhile trip down the M40, all agreed.

Next, outside cattle from Trevallion Stud saw Herefords, aged 19-20 months, sell for £1490 and £1370, with sisters making £1175. RJB followed with suckled Charolais calves, selling to £1365, with 6-7 month-old calves trading either side of £1000. They then sold 15-16 month-old steers for £1300-£1360. The famous Manor Farm Partners sold Hereford bucket steers for £1390 at 19 months.

Messrs. Holberton then sent framed Angus bucket steers to a barnstorming trade. 22-24 monthold Angus steers topped at £1870, £1810, and £1760.

Overall, it was a trade as dear as we've seen, and the cold weather combined with the cattle shortage should encourage further sales.
