Short on numbers today with the Bank Holiday and 6 day standstill from Fridays Sheep Fair. Those forward again struggling for finish and trade harder to hold albeit we posted the days highest SQQ at 248p/kg. Lean lambs becoming very hard to place with Export very decerning and Kill out percentages plummeting to levels not previously seen, presumably a consequence of the weather. That said plenty of Buyers support and trade appropriate and well ahead of £5.30 on the hook. Top today a nice return from R Richins, Oxford with classy lambs to 281p/kg at 42kg ahead of John Barnett at 37kg to 278p/kg and smart lambs from IM Allen & Partners, Leicester to 276p/ kg. R Richins 44kg to 273p/kg and G Woodard 41kg to 273p/kg. Heavies perhaps the easiest commodity to sell and well chased throughout. Top Humphrey Livestock at 265p/kg at 47kg with SM Ellingworth 47kg to 264p/kg equal with 49.5kg from R F Wilson and 50kg from MFH Farming. In the lump the job still totting up well considering a high number of small lambs to return an avg of £109. Top Export today 44kg to £120 from R Richins and 45.5kg from B C Burton to £120. R Richins £118 for 42kg and B Burton 45kg to £118 with G Woodard £118 at 45kg also. Heavies very well chased today topping at £147 for 66kg from RJ Batchelor and 62kg £145 from E Brain & Sons ltd. £142 for 63kg from Messrs Batchelor with FJ Tombs & Son 57kg to £141 equal with RJ Osborn. Trade very acceptable but lean lambs becoming hard to market as continental Europe demand a higher class of lamb.

The 5th Annual NEMSA Sheep Fair seeing a 95.6% clearance of the 4560 Breeding Females penned. A full ring, and accounts purchasing throughout the Midlands and Welsh Borders alongside Sheep making the long Journey to Cumbria, Lancashire and Yorkshire.

Aged Ewes a harder sell than the July Sale as the early lambing systems become fully stocked. C Mann, Stratford saw Charolais Ewes to £170 and Charolais from J Morris to £163. 6T Texel x from the Culworth Grounds dispersal saw £150 and smart aged Texel x from JB Elkington to £154. Aged Suffolk Ewes £150 from AC & RCW Turney. Double Theaves well chased throughout and seeing Charolais to £165 from Joseph Morris and then on into a Dispersal of Mules from Mythe Farm Ltd selling there 125 to £148 with pen after pen at £140.

Theaves:

White face Theaves very much in demand seeing the first pen into the ring sell pure Texel Theaves to £298 beaten shortly after by DJ Leadbeater at £300 with real power and scope. S Gore saw £257 for her pen of 8 Texels before DS & LE Wadland entered the £200 plus club at £221 for Beltex x Charolais Theaves selling to a Nottinghamshire Shepherdess. Strong Texel x to £195 from LC Threadgold and £195 for Cheviot Mules from RJ Batchelor. Home baking - Fruit Cake

Ingredients:

10oz (275g) currants

6oz (175g) sultanas

6oz (175g) raisins

4oz (100g) glace cherries, quartered

4oz (100g) ready to eat apricot, snipped into pieces

2oz (mixed candied peel, finely chopped

3 tablespoons brandy

8oz (225g) plain flour

1/4 teaspoon grated or dried nutmeg

1/2 teaspoon mixed spice

8oz (225g) soft margarine or softened butter

8oz (225g) dark muscovado sugar

4 large eggs

2oz (50g) whole almonds, chopped

1 scant tablespoon black treacle

grated rind of 1 lemon

grated rind of 1 orange

To finish:

Brandy to feed

Method:

Begin this cake the night before you want to bake it. Measure the prepared fruits into a large bowl, mix in the brandy, cover and leave in a cool place over night.

Pre-heat the oven to $140^{\circ}/275^{\circ}$ F/Gas 1. Grease and line an 8in (20cm) deep round cake tin with a double layer of greased greaseproof paper.

Measure the flour, spices, margarine or butter, sugar, eggs, almonds, treacle, lemon and orange rinds into a large bowl. Beat well to mix thoroughly, then fold in the soaked fruits. Spoon the mixture into the prepared tin and spread out evenly with the back of a spoon.

Cover the top of the cake loosely with a double layer of greaseproof paper.

Bake in the pre-heated oven for about $4-4\frac{1}{2}$ hours or until the cake feels firm to the touch and a skewer inserted into the centre comes out clean. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

When cool, pierce the cake at intervals with a fine skewer and feed with a little brandy. Wrap the completely cold cake in a double layer of greaseproof paper and again in foil and store in a cool place for up to 3 months, feeding a t intervals with more brandy.

Leave undecorated.
