

Thoughts from the Board

Last time we published a notes from the board was just after covid had reared its ugly head. I bet none of us thought it would go on for so long and cause so much disruption in our lives. Farmers being fairly solitary continued with their lives, we were outside, we were doing our normal jobs. Some things such as going out, going to market, and meeting friends at the pub were curtailed. But we were a lot better off than people shut in a flat with 2 or 3 young kids and only allowed out for a short time. Things are getting back to normal, if this is what the new normal is. Many things have changed, there seems to be a shortage of labour over the whole country. It cannot all be blamed on EU citizens going home, the furlough scheme, provided by the government, seems to have made people lazier and less inclined to work if they don't have to. Hopefully this will settle down and more people will return to normal working when money isn't free.

The market has had its problems but luckily not major ones, we are actively looking for an auctioneer, to work alongside Tom and take some pressure off him. It is not proving easy to find the right person. We are still looking for a full-time yardman to take care of the repair and maintenance at the market, we are also looking for drovers, all markets have a turnover of drovers as some move away and others move to other jobs. Your sons and daughters will be welcome if they wish to earn money on sale days.

This year we did not have an AGM, we held off as long as possible hoping we could have a normal one but, in the end, had to have one by the dreaded zoom. Basically, this adopted the accounts to keep us legal with the powers that be. The AGM in 2021 will hopefully be back to normal. Sheep sales have been flying, both breeding and fat, the trade has dropped off a bit at the moment. According to the buyers both lambs and ewes are still wanted but the must be the right goods, lambs need creep feed to put that final bit of finish on them. Ewes that get too fat are of no use to the buyers who basically want lean meat.

The fat cattle ring is flying, sellers are being well rewarded for finishing cattle properly. Best end cattle selling to £2.90. even the ordinary O grades are getting over £2.00. Again, the problem with the fat ring is too many stores going through it. I cannot say it is wrong as it is easier than TB testing them, but quite often some of them would make more in the store ring. Store cattle, they look expensive. And probably are but we have to keep doing something. What else will eat grass in fields that cannot be ploughed or mowed. Store cattle are short, we are paying for the amount of suckler cows slaughtered a few years ago.

The calf sale is always popular and well attended by buyers.

The board discusses many things at our twice monthly meetings one of them being the new market and if we are getting one. And the answer is..... we don't know. RFM are dealing with the showground owners not HS2 and when we ask them for an update, they don't seem to be able to answer us.

We need to modify the dirty water system as it does not deal with the straw and sawdust very well-it blocks up. If anyone has any ideas, they would be welcome.

The lorry wash has been better, but someone stole one of the new pipes and lances. I know they are expensive, but it would be better if they bought their own.

One of the biggest problems in the market is rubbish, it gets in the muck and the separator. It is amazing how many people in the market just throw their cans bottles and even mugs on the floor. Hopefully you all know who the board members are and feel that you can talk to us about the market. I cannot guarantee that we will be able to do things as you would like as we must consider all things and how they impact other customers and our staff. But that doesn't mean you cannot mention it.

Finally, please try and be safe, there are too many horror stories in the farming press about Farmers, their families and their workers and the impact of accidents on the farms. A little bit of thought and a little bit less rush might be the difference.


