# SPRING HOGGS 1227 FORWARD SQQ 366P/KG AVG £163.37

Hoggs: OVERALL AVG £163!!!!

After a non-stop schedule of sales throughout the festive period, which saw trades at new levels, everyone expected the trade to steady for the beginning of 2025. However, the weather had other ideas. With many farmers unable to market sheep nationally, a shortage of sheep on Monday morning led to what was possibly the dearest trade we have ever seen.

A yarding dominated today by Hoggs from the Green area meant a returning buyer at ringside. Numbers were depleted by the weather and road closures, with some farmers having to return home quickly to deal with floods. Despite this, the 1,250 Hoggs forward received an SQQ of 366p/kg, equal to £7.82 deadweight equivalent. The yarding was fairly short on numbers and quality, but those with meat saw massive rewards throughout.

400p/kg was no barrier today, with the top price achieved by clean-presented Beltex from D W Gurney at 38kg, selling to 437p/kg. BJ & IS Wain followed with 38.5kg at 429p/kg, and VJ Roots achieved 421p/kg. Mickler Farming (Gloucestershire), G & E Livestock (Norfolk), Matt Morris, and Steve Timms all broke the 400p/kg mark. Meat and shape were trading at 390p/kg plus, with first-cross Hoggs trading between 365p/kg and 390p/kg. The leaner Suffolk sorts traded around 355-360p/kg, while some very lean store sorts, still worth more as store lambs, were trading around 300p/kg.

Meat and finish were key now, certainly not weight. Heavier Hoggs were trading at 340-350p/kg for quality, with the best fetching more. Lean heavies were harder to place, trading around 300-320p/kg. Export weights reached a massive £175.50 for 44kg from G & E Livestock (Norfolk), with VJ Roots achieving £174 for 44kg, Lambs End 45kg at £170, Ted Taylor 44kg at £170, and D W Gurney following with 3 pens at £170.

Heavies were well chased if they had meat, with the top price of the day being £205 for 60kg from Roger Coombes for his first draw of the year. Robert Goode celebrated his birthday with 3 trailer loads of stock dragged through the floods to see 60kg Hoggs at £204, and DW Gurney achieved £204 for 66kg. JK Smith & Sons, J Gowling & Sons, and Messrs Coombes all beat the £200 mark. Plenty of heavy lambs were sold for over £120.

This trade was completely unsustainable but purely a result of supply and demand at work. A big thank you to all vendors who struggled through the weather. You were rewarded well, thankfully.

SHEEP NOW NEED BELLY CLIPPING: If the belly wool or dirt can fold back and touch the first incision at slaughter, they need clipping!

### **CULL EWES: 446 FORWARD**

Numbers were very short for all the same reasons as the lambs. We thought the lambs were dear, but the ewes left the lambs in their dust. It was a bedraggled yarding of Mules and Cracker Ewes in the main, with an all-in average of £163.30. Simply a flyer, and dearer than we have ever seen, with meated ewes almost all fetching over £200!

The top price today was achieved by Texel rams from Harrison Bros, which sold to £252. Texel x Lleyn ewes from Colban Ltd reached £240, and Lleyn rams from T Kirk sold for £235. There wasn't much shape to speak of, but white-faced and first-cross white faces were trading at £200 plus. Suffolks reached £240 for D Dashwood and £228 for H L Goode & Son, with Suffolks generally trading at £190 plus.

Mules were on fire, with no real strength but a top of £194 for RJ Paybody & Son, and TS TL Enterprises at £192. Plenty of Mules were trading around the £180 mark if weighted, but meat in general was trading upwards of £155.
