

Please remember that an animal must be fit for the intended journey, it should not be ill, injured or severley lame ie. must be full weight bearing.

These sheep are being rejected at abattoirs around the Country

As deadweight prices tumble, the live ring battles to hold firm, and maintains some excellent levels of returns. Trade for all goods today, and with the upcoming festival some of those plainer shaped sorts looking well sold.

Steers-

A tidy show of steers today, with some big lads throughout the entry. Top today saw proper Limousin steers from Cecil Thomas to 400p/kg equal with a whopper of a bullock from Frank Page. CD Harrison selling to 395p/kg also for weight with CW Reay & Son to 393p/kg.

Weight today topping at £3049.56 from CW Thomas, with the Page stable to a top of £3032. David Powers seeing strong sorts to £2910.60, with CD Harrison to a top of £2883.50.

Heifers-

Shape and cover still key and some corkers on show here today. Top of the pops saw Page Bros to 441p/kg with Dashwood Partners hot on his heels to 418p/kg for a properly fed sort. GR Fountaine sold to 417p/kg with CW Thomas to 415p/kg. Parry Walters with a corker to 414p/kg with LW Howe to 406p/kg.

The biggest week of the year for the Lamb industry saw a good yarding of 1780 Spring Lambs met a trade that just got dearer all day from start to finish to leave an SQQ of 400p/kg. A real trade for all types and the best yarding of quality seen for quite some time and massively appreciated. Export weight Hoggs 36 – 42kg almost all over 400p/kg and only the 43 – 45kg range dragging the SQQ slightly as many in the weight Category larger than required. Best end well chased. First draw for Mark Lambert and a top of 455p/kg at 40kg for Texels full of gibbett. J & R Lowe with proper finished shape 444p/kg before a super lorry load from C & A Morley 40 and 39kg at 442 & 441p/kg. Messrs Cobley and Shaw also beating 440p/kg. Shape travelling all past 430p/kg with run of the mill Export Lambs 400-420p/kg. Weight like for like disadvantaged by 20p/kg. Heavies to 404p/kg at 45.5kg from J & R Lowe with AV Boffey 46kg and J & R Lowe 47kg 400 – 402p/kg. Heavies today generally 350p/kg plus and much harder placed than the Exports.

All in Avg of £164.34 a serious return and Vendors heavily rewarded. Topping at £199 for 53kg from Bob Tofield and £191 for Jo Webster at 48kg and C & A Morley at 46kg. Pen after pen of meat breaking £180.!!
