VET ATTESTATIONS



Following a meeting with Warwickshire Trading Standards & the FSA on Monday we have been asked to highlight the Welfare Issues being reported from the Abbattoirs regarding Cull Ewes. These mainly relate to MASTITIS & LAMENESS. Condition Score i.e being very thin.

Please remember that an animal must be fit for the intended journey, it should not be ill, injured or severley lame ie. must be full weight bearing.

These sheep are being rejected at abattoirs around the Country

With the weather Conditions and element of negativity around the Midlands for grazing Animals, but the prominence of this fixture now firmly stuck in everyone's diary as the date to buy quality replacements. This year saw more travelled buyers with Sheep finding homes in all the local Counties plus this year, Devon, Yorkshire, Norfolk, Wiltshire, Lancashire and Suffolk.

As ever our thanks to Hawes Branch of NEMSA for Sponsorship of the Show and Sale and even more to our Judges this year. Mr Geoffrey Porter, Reeth representing the North and Mr Sam Harrison and Miss Georgie Harrison, Saddington representing the Midlands.

Starting with the aged Ewes the first pen of the day set the tone when seeing NCM FM Ewes from Messrs Weston to £181 followed by Welsh Mules FM from MJ Woodward at £185. Into the Flock Dispersal for Dashwood Partners and we saw these FM Suffolk x Scotch Halfbreds sell in pens of 20 at £238. £230 x2 and £219.

Into the Double Theaves and a nice pen from R & J Hull saw Suffolks at £225 with Messrs Weston £184. Into the Theaves and Continentals a selective trade but shape from Rhys and James Hull saw £270 for ¾ bred Texels and Cheviots from the same £262. Passmore & Nunnerley £252 for Texel x. Middle of the road clear headed sheep trading eitherside of £220 with lesser bred hard to get away and trading under £200.

Suffolks well chased throughout selling £200 plus and topping at £222 for Southfield Farms and £220 for M J Woodward.

Into the Mules and plenty of trade from start to finish. A yarding lacking the usual quality and size due to the weather conditions. Strong sheep with backs trading regularly £230 plus with best often £260 and over. Preference for lambed Sheep albeit the weather hitting lambed sheep hard and often making sheep short on condition. Lesser bred or fed Theaves looking the dearest on the day with many needing £30 of feed to get them fit to tup. Ran dry strength perhaps dearer on the year as Buyers looked for sheep able to be turned to little keep with Cottesbrooke seeing a top of their 300 at £247 and plenty of pens £241. Nice headed sheep all over £250 and with R Smith & Son £263 and £252. Welsh from the same £255. G Stephens took two pens to £260. JonJoe Morris lost his title as Champion this year but topped at £296 for pens full and £310 for Singles. A super run of Scotch Mules from the same to £286 x2. RP Hutchings first go at Mules saw upstanding Theaves at £265 & £250. Hannah Collett showed way with nice headed singles to £270. Before A & J Collett saw pens at £260 and Singles £263. Champion recrowned Henry Tustain started a big weekend for the family when taking the Champions at £318 for the pens full selling to Dorset before selling the Champion single at £405. Pens from this home also seeing £280, £265 and £264.

A trade to keep all parties happy. Trade well ahead of expectations but Buyers happy to receive sheep that have been given the extra care needed this year. Thanks to all the Vendors, Hauliers, Sponsors and Buyers for making such a great day.

Trade holding steady but resistance being felt throughout the red meat sector and this noticed today.

Steers -

Best end bullocks still a real flier, with PR Mann & Son seeing proper Limmy steers to 387p/kg, with H & J East matching the figure for heavyweight Blues. Well fed Angus from J Windridge & Son sold to 383p/kg matching Limousin steers from HW & AJ Eadon. Shape actively 350p/kg plus but meat key.

Top grossing steers from H & J East saw heavyweight Simmentals to £3040.72 with Merris Bros Farmers LTD selling enormous Angus steers to £2967.12. John East struck again with Blues to £2910.24. D Powers saw OTM Blues to £2907.72, with HW & AJ Eadon topping at £2895.48.

Heifers -

More weight in the heifers today, so those sweet butcher types a real premium. Top today saw Tom Reeve selling Lims to 400p/kg, with PR Mann selling to 398p/kg. HW & AJ Eadon saw Limousins to 398p/kg, with PR Mann selling to 397p/kg. Angus from RW & HER Trivett selling to 396p/kg, with Pete Jarrom seeing meat to 389p/kg.

Top grossing heifers from HW & AJ Eadon & Son seeing weighted Angus to £2694.34 with PR Mann selling Angus to £2689.28, with the same home selling Limousin heifers to £2501.10. Fresh face Martin Blackwell saw Charolais sired heifers to £2352.48.

Prime Lambs;

Trade continues to faulter albeit if you have meat they are wanted with an all in Avg of £143. Lean lambs now trading below levels expected in the Store ring. Sales of Lamb are very depressed and consequently buyers very fussy with the deadweight system hitting hard on grids also. An SQQ of 318.6p/kg the dearest for the Nation on the day! Meat needed and Buyers bidding well for good Lambs. Top today saw meat and shape rewarded with a top of 431p/kg for Chiltern Beltex whilst Humphrey Livestock saw 404p/kg at 45kg and Will Warner selling 42kg to 400p/kg. Good Meat lambs trading 345p/kg plus regularly with first cross 320p/kg plus. Lean lambs trading around 300p/kg and very lean realisation.

Weight still the easiest sold but at reduced rates. W J Pearson 48kg at 367p/kg and 46.5kg at 359p/kg with J M Ironmonger 48kg at 356p/kg selling others 48kg 352p/kg

In the imap Export Lambs topping out at £182 for 45kg from Humphrey Livestock also selling 44kg at £174 with GR Fountaine & Son £168 at 45kg and W Warner 42kg at £168. Overall a top of £186 & £185 for JK Smith & Son with E J Taylor & Son £185 x 2. 50 pens of lambs trading over £170.

Trading not a disaster but in all honesty Farmers trying to push the problems caused by the drought on to Abbatoirs. This is holding the trade back and Vendors are encouraged to ensure Lambs are fit to kill.


