VET ATTESTATIONS



Please remember that an animal must be fit for the intended journey, it should not be ill, injured or severley lame ie. must be full weight bearing.

These sheep are being rejected at abattoirs around the Country

A fantastic turnout for the Stratford Breeding Sheep Field Sale, on possibly the only wet day of the Summer!

A lovely entry of sheep from across the Stratford area saw buyers travelling to purchase quality stock.

Suffolks to kick the day off saw G Hookham selling to £205 for stretchy sheep, before moving into the Continental which saw Texel Theaves from J Albutt trading to £210.

The main event saw some super runs of Mule Theaves, both dry and lambed finding plenty of enquiry. Topping the Mules was Rob Hutchings, Shipston on Stour with a super run selling to £250, with other pens to £248 x3 and £242. A Cook saw a strong pen of dry sheep to a top of £240 with CW Cowper selling away to the same figure, with David Gabb selling to £230.

On into the ewe lambs, seeing Suffolk x NCM saw David Wilson selling to £168, with Cheviot x Mules from the same stable to £165. Texel x from W Bartlett sold to £158 with R & T Reever selling Suffolks to £150.

Rams selling well, topping at 610gns for Texel Shearlings from Merrick & Julie Pinny, with the same home selling Charollais Ram Lambs to 585gns.

A grand show of store lambs saw trade sharp throughout, selling to £122 and £118 respectively for Townsend Farms, Cherington. Strong lambs all £110+ with the best of the mediums around the £100 mark. Longer keep medium lambs £88-£92 with very few small lambs forward but these £78-£83. An all in average of £94.36 very respectable.

A tidy show of cattle forward with a shade more life in the job, with best end sorts dearer on the week.

Bullocks -

A storming Limousin bullock from RW & HER Trivett topped at 435p/kg, with NAS Johnson selling Limousin steers to the same figure. The Johnson stable struck again at 420p/kg with Tom Reeve with handy weights to 418p/kg, just pipping AGM Farndon who saw Limousins to 410p/kg.

A massive Limousin bullock from Cecil Thomas topped at £3224 with heavyweights from NAS Johnson selling to £2965 & £2923, with the Trivetts selling to £2914. The top 10 grossing steers today all trading over £2600.

Heifers -

Home baking - Fruit Cake

Ingredients:

225g (8oz) S R Flour

1 tsp mixed spice

½ tsp ground cinnamon

½ tsp ground nutmeg

175g (6oz) butter

175g (6oz) soft brown sugar

1 tbsp black treacle

1 tsp each grated orange and lemon rind

4 eggs

550g (1 1/4 lb) mixed dried fruit

100g (40z) chopped mixed peel

50g (2oz) glacé cherries

15ml milk

To finish: Brandy to feed

Method:

Pre-heat the oven to $150^{\circ}/300^{\circ}$ F/Gas 2. Grease and line an 8in (20cm) deep round cake tin with a double layer of greased greaseproof paper.

Sift flour with spice, cinnamon and nutmeg.

Cream butter with sugar, treacle and orange and lemon rind.

Beat in eggs, one at a time, and adding 1 tbsp of sifted dry ingredients with each other. Stir in mixed fruit, chopped peel, and cherries.

Fold in dry ingredients alternately with milk.

Transfer to prepared tin and smooth top with a knife. Bake for 4 – 4 ½ hours or until a skewer comes out clean. Leave in tin for 15 minutes then turn out onto a wire cooling rack.

When cool, pierce the cake at intervals with a fine skewer and feed with a little brandy. Wrap the completely cold cake in a double layer of greaseproof paper and again in foil and store in a cool place for up to 3 months, feeding at intervals with more brandy.

Leave undecorated
