

STORE CATTLE - 23rd OCTOBER



Store Cattle

A nice October yarding of Cattle with a full ring of buyers.

Today we started with a Retirement Dispersal on behalf of Bevin & Co, Willey of the Summer Calving Herd with South Devon Calves. The run topping at £2520 for a 2021 AA Cow with her 5m Calf at foot with others £2290 and £2100 for older traditional Cows. In-calf Heifers to £2160 at 28m.

Into the Stores and plenty of demand albeit best end sorts the order of the day with young Charolais Steers from EC Parker & Son kicking us off at £1740 9m others £1600 and Heifers £1440. Bucket sorts from D & GM Wright £1150 for Herefords 13m.

Strength of age the theme for DJ Harris seeing Angus Steers to £1910 for a pen of 9 14-15m Steers. Yearling Blue Heifers from the same to £1170.

Buckets from N Hague & Son Ltd saw Angus Steers 16m at £1870 and Limousin £1700. With Bucket Blues 14m at £1380. S & J Farming always pulling a team of Buyers selling Single Suckled Charolais at £2340 at 17m and yearlings £2010 with sisters £1630. Cotswolds calling next when WS Gabb Ltd did his first drag for the winter of Charolais Bucket Calves. Topping at £1690 for 12m Steers the run saw pen after pen over £1500 with heifers to £1620 at 14m and mainly trading around £1300.

RJB Farms saw a good run of Suckled sorts to £2000 for 15m Steers and plenty £1800 plus with 18m Heifers to £1910. Older sorts EC Parker saw Charolais Steers £1920 17m with others £1980 and £1920. Dairy quality from P Dyson £1860 at 17m before strong Herefords from DP Jones Ag Contractors saw £1940 and £1900 at 17 – 19m. PA Woodard sold aged Cattle to a large audience to see a top of £2210 for 19m Limousin Steers and Heifers £1900. Dairy Blues from Market Bosworth, M Jackson next saw £2000 at 23m with Angus £2030. Back following last years Blue Tongue zoning absence T H Lee & Son with Simmentals from their Montbeliarde dairy Herd. What a show and credit of Cattle from them. The wagon load topping at £2200 for 24m Steers and £2120 for Angus. Plenty of long Steers £1800 to £1950 throughout. Heifer to £1800 and pure Monty Steers to £1860.

A real trade and the traditional Autumn Sales doing their thing.

A final sale for this year at Stratford saw a tidy show entered and what a trade! Breeding sheep to start saw J Hope Sheep Services to £202 for Texel Theaves, with Beltex x Double Theaves from T Baker selling to £198. Suffolk Theaves from Rob Avery saw at top of £188 and looking well sold, with 6 tooth Suffolk x Lleyn ewes selling to £170 for J Hope. On into the stores, which saw trade throughout and the alleys packed with buyers. Top today saw Bromehall Farm selling big pens of Charollais x, with Jenny Gibbs selling to the same figure for super pens of Texels. Bromehall struck again selling to £130, with W Stock to £120. Strength generally £115 plus with the medium lambs looking the best sold between £108 and £112. Smalls short on the ground and looking a serious trade.

A handful of breeding rams selling to a top of 460gns for Suffolk Ram lambs from Merrick and Julie Pinny, with others to 450gns.

Another change of voice in the rostrum, and a smaller show of cattle than last week.

Meat wanted, with cover rewarded, and those half fed grassy sorts becoming a more difficult sell.

Steers -

A super lean meated Blonde from DR & JC Bennett topping the day at 415p/kg, with PC & RA Nichols close behind at 400p/kg for weighted Limousins. DJ Whitlock sold his run to a top of 390p/kg matching Limousins from the Nichols stable, with Angus from R Ellis & Son selling to the same figure, matching 34m Limousin steers from AE & AM Tacy.

Top gross today saw PC & RA Nichols selling to a top of £3152, with the same home selling big Simmentals to a top of £3140. Blondes from DR & JC Bennett sold to £2697, with Limousins to £2683 from DJ Whitlock.

Heifers -

A more mixed show with very few of those best butcher sorts forward. Top two spots taken by Pete Jarrom today selling to 405p/kg and 402p/kg. DJ Whitlock saw Limousin heifers to 394p/kg with DR & JC Bennett to 390p/kg for Blondes and R Ellis to 382p/kg for Angus heifers.

Top gross saw Dave Whitlock to £2553, with R Ellis & Son selling to £2490 with Angus heifers.

Lambs;

Trade perhaps up but a very poor yarding in numbers and in meat. Many lambs short of meat and in truth not fit to kill. Those with meat an improved trade and an SQQ of 323p/kg a real strong return with an Avg of £143 which is a discounted AVg considering the number of lambs bought as Stores. Best meat very well rewarded and selling to a premium topping at 407p/ kg at 44.5kg for G Woodard with Hillside Farm at 400p/kg for 39kg and MJ Woodward 44.5kg at 393p/kg. GM Woodard also 393p/kg at 44kg. Meat and finish trading all over 350p/kg albeit 44kg+ discounted 10p throughout. Medium unfed meat trading 320p/kg plus throughout with grass fed short of meat lambs 300p/kg mark and under. Heavies a nice trade for the fed albeit heavier end and grass fed Lambs now very hard to place with the Wholesale Markets in London selling Lambs at only 6.20p/kg hung up and Supermarket use limited. Heavies trading to 365p/kg at 46kg for GL & AM Woodard whom sold similar gods at 353 & 354p/kg. and heavies from AK Wilson 51kg at 353p/kg for properly fed sorts. Meat first quality lambs trading 330p/kg plus with lesser sorts 300p/kg mark and run of the mill 280p/kg plus. In the lump Export Lambs to £181 for 44.5kg from MJ Woodward whom sold the same at £175 and £174 with Messrs Woodard at £172 for 44kg and Woody then £171 for two pens in a row. Weight always pays and the best fed lambs of the day from AK Wilson saw a top of £206 at 74kg, £200 at 64kg and £192 at 55kg from Ann Wilson, Northampton. FJ Tombs & Sons 62kg at £182.

Trade lifting to shortage of lambs nationally but quality of fed lambs in short supply and grass lambs being sold very low on the open trading floors.
