VET ATTESTATIONS



Please remember that an animal must be fit for the intended journey, it should not be ill, injured or severley lame ie. must be full weight bearing.

These sheep are being rejected at abattoirs around the Country

Store Cattle

A year soon rolls around and we are back into suckled calf season, with a fantastic turn out of both vendors and buyers for this years Sale.

The pre show sale for the Craig Thompson Memorial Trophy ably judged by Mr Richard Sharpe, Melton Mowbray and as every hotly contested.

Coming away as this years undisputed champions saw JK Smith & Sons with a Limousin steer at 8 months old selling to £2200, with the judge backing his decision. Bulls first in the ring saw young man in farming George Scrivens topping at £1620 for Simmentals at 8 months with brothers to £1440. On then into the clean cattle which saw George remaining in the hot seat with square Simmental steers to £1880 with stable mates to £1690, all at 8 months. Strength from RS & GDH Alderman sold to £1830 for Simmental steers with Angus in the ring next from J & IJ Tivey roaring away to £1700, with the same stable to £1380 at 9 months.

H Smith & Sons saw Charolais sired steers in the ring to £1860 at 8 months with Limousins from the same stable to £1720. Lester Smith saw Charolais steers to £1700 with heifers to £1270 at 8 months.

On into a grand run from JK Smith & Son who topped their run at £2200 for Limousins steers, with others to £2100 and £2020. Simmental steers sold to £1940 at 9 months with heifers topping at £1820 for Limousins at 9 months, with Simmental heifers to £1320. The run of 64 averaged a whopping £1691.

A pleasure to see the return of C & A Morley this year, with Charolais steers to £1940 and the same stable to £1820 and £1800 at 8 months. Sisters from this good home topped at £1700 with others to £1420.

Good to see Steve and Elaine Friswell back with their annual consignment to sell Angus steers to £1560, with others to £1490 and Angus heifers to a top of £1510. Moving into their Limousins saw a top of £1720 with sisters to £1510.

S & J Farming saw Charolais sired steers to £1800 with last man in the ring DA & JE Bromwich topping his run with Limousins at £1900, with the same home selling to £1650 for heifers.
