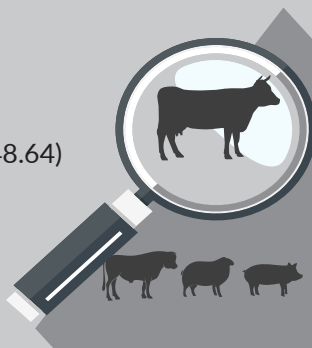

Following a meeting with Warwickshire Trading Standards & the FSA on Monday we have been asked to highlight the Welfare Issues being reported from the Abattoirs regarding Cull Ewes. These mainly relate to MASTITIS & LAMENESS. Condition Score i.e being very thin.

Please remember that an animal must be fit for the intended journey, it should not be ill, injured or severely lame i.e. must be full weight bearing.

A very good yarding at a time when Store Cattle are short across the country. Trade reflecting this and a real trade throughout with an all in Avg to include weanlings of £1645!!!

Bulls to begin from S Scholes £1930 at only 7m of age for Beef Shorthorns. Other older sorts £1900.

Starting with younger sorts TB4 up from Bedfordshire saw GC James & Co sell to £1240 for Lincoln Reds at only 8m. Suckled Calves then next from Steve and Elaine Friswell with 7m Limousin x Steers at £1660. Into the Buckets and a run of well done Angus from various vendors. M Squire first selling to £1620 and £1570 11 - 12m of age with sisters in big pens £1090. N Hague & Son next with Angus Steers £1590 14-15m and Limousin x Heifers £1360.

S Scholes then with marvellously done sorts to see a big enquiry. Starting at £1900 for 8m British Blue Steers. Yearlings from the same £1660 and £1600 for Bucket sorts. Heifers to £1500 for Beef Shorthorn 14m. Quality rewarded and WJ Pearson & Son down off the Banbury Hills to avg over £2000 for the consignment. Topping at £2200 with Charolais 14m and Simmentals £1980 12m with others £1900. Back into the Buckets and Willow Farms selling to £1610 for Angus Steers 15m of age with sisters to £1490 & £1450. Blue Steers saw £1650 13-14m with 17m Steers to £1690. Heifers to £1560. Outside genuine Herefords from Trevallion Farming with Steers to £1690 at 15m of age others £1580 & £1590.

Bevin and Co with last years Calves from the Herd Dispersal to see South Devon & Simmentals to £1760 14-16m with others £1730. Heifers to £1450 at 15m. Dairy men reaping the rewards seeing £1970 for Blues at 20m with younger Herefords £1600 17m.

Top gross figures today saw RW & HER Trivett selling to £3196 and £3173 for Limousins, with DTP Walters seeing Limousins to £3095, with Martin Nichols topping at £2944.

Prime Heifers -

Lambs;

Numbers desperately short on the ground as was meat. The Weather at the weekend washing the backs off lambs. Meat in very short supply and many of todays lambs being bought for Feeding at a trade over that of the meat Value. Abbatoirs in need of numbers and meat 2000 more needed on the day. Best end meat a trade throughout. Meat on show rare but M Thornber hitting the top at 400p/kg at 40kg for Texel types and T Baker grass finished Beltex 41kg at 393p/kg. 44kg Charolais from AV Boffey nice meat to see 382p/kg with Messrs Baker 44kg at 377p/kg. An SQQ of 329p/kg depressed by the quality but at 45% puts the lambs at £7.30 on the hook!

Meat Export weight lambs all over 345p/kg. Leaner sorts 320 p/kg mark and store sorts with weight 300p/kg. Meat very short. Weight well chased seeing 357p/kg for SLAM Farming at 46kg with Croft Farms, Tamworth 48kg at 338p/kg. Lambs with finish all trading over 335p/kg and weight in general all over 310p/kg unless super heavy. Heavy lambs today the best meat on show. A poorer yarding but the per head Avg up to £149 all in. Showing the rate of demand for meat.

Export Lambs to a top of £168 at 44kg from AV Boffey with T Baker 44kg at £166 and 41kg at £161. M Thornber £160 at 40kg. Heavy lambs topping the day to see a top of £190 for 71kg from D W Morley whom also sold at £186, £185 and £180. B & SM Sutton £180 and H L Goode & Son £180. Plenty of meat well over £160 today.

A yard of ewes which can only be described as mixed. Plenty of weight forward, but at least 50 Soay and Badger Faced Welsh ewes included in the average today. Best end Continental ewes soaring to £240 for a proper Texel ewe from MJ Woodward, with VJ Roots selling Charollais to £220. Pete Allen saw Texels to £200, matching with LG Eadon & Son and T Eadon & Son. Continental ewes with weight generally £170-£180, with smaller sorts £140-£150 and grazing types around the £120 mark.

Suffolks to a top of £210 for S & J Farming, with RC & J Mann to £202 and Wolverton Farm to £201. Suffolks with weight £180-£190, with very few mediums around but these trading £150-£160.
